The Flow of the Worship Service

Our worship service has an intentional order to it. The flow of worship is called the liturgical movement. The movement reminds us weekly of our journey in faith of moving from being separated from God by sin, to being restored by God's grace as disciples of Christ. It is based on the sixth chapter of the Biblical book of Isaiah.

- (1) God welcomes us and invites us
- (2) We respond to God's call by worshiping Him
- (3) We confess our need for God's forgiveness and grace
- (4) We are assured of God's forgiveness and grace
- (5) We learn more about God's will through scripture, song, and sermon
- (6) We grow closer to God and one another through prayer
- (7) We give God thanks by offering our time, talent, and treasure
- (8) We experience the greater oneness with God and each other through Communion
- (9) God sends us into the world to share His love and grace with others

About Today

Church Season: Pentecost –which is the season of the church in mission. It is the time between the ascension of Christ and his second coming, which is the time we are presently living in today, and as such is the longest season of the church year. During this season we focus on how we, as disciples of Jesus Christ, are called by God to go out into the world and share his Good News through both our deeds and words.

Color of the Paraments (cloths on the altar and pulpit):

Green –symbolizing the growth of the Christian church, as we go out into the world and share God’s Good News with both our words and actions, and invite others into the church of Jesus Christ.

The suggested scripture lessons are from the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL), which selects passages throughout the Bible over a three year cycle. The RCL is the most common lectionary used by Christian churches. We are in **Year C**, which emphasizes the Gospel of Luke.

The Bible is in two sections: Old Testament - OT (scripture prior to Christ’s birth), located in the first 2/3 of the Bible; and New Testament - NT (about Christ & early church). The first four books of the NT are called the “Gospels,” which Christians consider the most central books of the Bible; the rest of the NT takes place after his ascension into heaven.

Isaiah

The book of Isaiah (OT) is attributed to three prophets. The first of whom is from where the book gets its name, and is about Isaiah’s call to become a prophet and his prophecy that Jerusalem will face God’s judgement regarding its immorality in order to e God’s Holy City (chaps. 1-9, written 738-688 B.C.), the second is about living in exile in Babylon (chaps. 40-55, written 597-539 B.C.), and the third is about the return from exile to Judah and the rebuilding of the Temple (chaps. 56-66, written 520-515 B.C.). A prophet is one who is divinely appointed by God to lead and instruct.

Psalm 66:1-9

This OT song of praise and thanksgiving affirms God’s providential deliverance of God’s people.

The Letter of Paul to the Galatians

This NT Epistle (letter) was written to the churches of Galatia by the apostle Paul sometime between 49-55 A.D. Within this letter is the critical theological doctrine of justification by faith (salvation by God’s actions through Jesus Christ, not by our own actions). Paul was a Christian, Jew, Pharisee, Roman citizen, and church leader, who had a direct encounter with Jesus Christ on the road to Damascus after Jesus’ ascension into heaven. Paul wrote more of the NT than any other person.

The Gospel According to Luke

The Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles is attributed to Luke “the beloved physician,” written around 59-90 A.D. (C.E.). Not having met Jesus personally, Luke undertook the task of “investigating everything carefully from the very first, to write an orderly account” of Jesus Christ, “so that you may know the truth concerning the things about which you have been instructed.”

From the Addiction & Recovery Taskforce: Step Four

We made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.

The purpose of the Fourth Step is to find out who we really are. As we prepare for this step, our fear must be put aside. Instead, we turn to the loving, personal God that we have found. A written inventory will help us to unlock parts of our subconscious that deny our true nature. Honest self assessment is one of the keys to our new way of life, and most of us find that we are neither as terrible nor as wonderful as we once thought.

Step Four is not a confession of how horrible we are or what a bad person we have been, rather we gain strength and insight. Steps One, Two, and Three are the necessary preparation before taking this step. We put our inventory on paper so that we can see it for what it really is and release it. Writing honestly and thoroughly may seem impossible but we turn to our Higher Power for the strength to be fearless and thorough. We write about our defects, assets, relationships and past and present history. The way to write an inventory is to simply write it. Thinking or talking about it will not get it written.

At times this may seem difficult or painful but we come to realize how much we have to gain, and the pain of doing it is less than the pain of not doing it. Pain can be a motivating factor in recovery.

When issues surface, we write about them. The inventory process releases the stress trapped inside of us. We ask for God's help to reveal the things that cause us pain and suffering. We are not perfect, we are human, but we develop an ability to survive our emotions using the tools in recovery. We want to continue this journey by taking an equally
