In 1888 St. Paul's Reformed Church was founded in Robesonia.

In 1903 they merged to become St. Paul's Reformed Church in Robesonia; in 1934 the congregation became St. Paul's Evangelical & Reformed Church; and in 1957 became St. Paul's United Church of Christ.

## The Flow of the Worship Service

Our worship service has an intentional order to it. The flow of worship is called the liturgical movement. The movement reminds us weekly of our journey in faith of moving from being separated from God by sin, to being restored by God's grace as disciples of Christ. It is based on the sixth chapter of the Biblical book of Isaiah.

(1) God welcomes us and invites us

(2) We respond to God's call by worshiping Him

(3) We confess our need for God's forgiveness and grace

(4) We are assured of God's forgiveness and grace

(5) We learn more about God's will through scripture, song, and sermon

(6) We grow closer to God and one another through prayer

(7) We give God thanks by offering our time, talent, and treasure

(8) God sends us into the world to share His love and grace with others

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# **Seraphim Incense**

Seraphim Incense is made of smoothly blended frankincense (one of the three gifts of the magi). Frankincense is mentioned in the Bible 19 times. Seraphim is one of the most popular blends of incense to use during worship, in part because of its name and because it is one of the best known incenses found in scripture. Also, in part because seraphim is a milder blend -- the aroma is not as strong -- and therefore not as distracting for those who are not used to incense - particularly when used indoors.

Seraphim are six winged angels. Seraphim is plural, and seraph is singular. Seraphim are the "angelic choirs of angels" that stand closest to the throne of God and continually sing the "Seraphic Hymn," which is the "Holy, holy, holy" that we commonly sing during communion services.

Seraph literally means "burning ones." In Isaiah 6, the prophet Isaiah's ministry begins with a seraph touching his mouth with a live coal, saying to him "Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out." St. Thomas Aquinas gives three important characteristics of fire that give seraphim their name: (1) fire is always and continuously moving upwards, seraphim without exception move towards God; (2) fire cleanses completely, seraphim seek purity before God; and (3) fire is bright and gives light to others, seraphim enlighten others with their inextinguishable pure light.

In Christianity, there are commonly 7-9 classifications of angels. These are commonly organized into three spheres: those in the heavenly realm: Seraphim, Cherubim, and Thrones; those focused on cosmic affairs: Dominions, Virtues, and Powers; and those engaged in human matters: Principalities; Archangels; and Angels (also known as messenger angels).

In Judaism, seraphim is the fifth of 10 ranks of angels. From highest to lowest: Chayot Ha Kodesh, Ophanim, Erelim, Hashmallim, Seraphim, Malakhim (messenger angels), Elohim (Godly beings), Bene Elohim (sons of Godly beings), Cherubim, and Ishim (manlike beings).
