That is why we ourselves boast about you in the churches of God.

INTRODUCTION

Association Representative (addressing the congregation):

We are here to enter a covenant. The people of God known as the United Church of Christ of Robesonia and the churches of God gathered in the Covenant Association rejoice to affirm that by the grace of God we intend to be the church together.

Consistory President:

We, the people of God in the United Church of Christ of Robesonia

Local Church Members:

- Acknowledge Jesus Christ, Son of God and Savior, as the sole Head of the church.
- We acknowledge as kindred in Christ all who share in this confession.
- We look to the Word of God in the Scriptures, and to the presence and power of the Holy Spirit, to prosper its creative and redemptive work in the world.
- We claim as our own the faith of the historic Church expressed in the ancient creeds and reclaimed in the basic insights of the Protestant Reformers.
- We affirm the responsibility of the Church in each generation to make this faith its own in reality of worship, in honesty of thought and expression, and in purity of heart before God.
- In accordance with the teaching of our Lord and the practice prevailing among evangelical Christians, we recognize two sacraments: Baptism and the Lord's Supper or Holy Communion.

Consistory President:

This is the story of our pilgrimage.

We recognize our historical roots to include the founding of the congregations of Zion German Reformed Church in Womelsdorf in 1792, St. Daniel's Reformed Church in Robesonia in 1876, St. Paul's Reformed Church in Robesonia in 1888, the merged St. Paul's Reformed Church in Robesonia in 1903, the merger of the Evangelical & Reformed Church denomination in 1934, and the merger founding the United Church of Christ denomination in 1957.

Association Representative:

We, the Covenant Association share your faith.

This is the story of our pilgrimage.

We too have been birthed from the German Reformed Church, shared in the merger to become the Evangelical and Reformed Church, shared in the merger to become the United Church of Christ, and shared in the merger of the Heidelberg, East Berks, and Reading Associations to become the Covenant Association of the United Church of Christ. We are in covenantal relationship with your congregation, with all the UCC congregations within our association, with the Pennsylvania Southeast Conference, and with the United Church of Christ and the ministries and organizations of our denomination.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION

Leader:

Lord, we remember that on the night of betrayal and desertion, and on the eve of death, Jesus gathered the disciples for the feast of Passover. About Today

Church Season: Epiphany - Season of the manifestation of God incarnate to the world. In Greek "phan" is "shine" or "manifest," and "epi" is "upon." The season of Epiphany continues from January 6 until Ash Wednesday.

Color of the Paraments (cloths on the altar and pulpit):

White - symbolizing the purity - the blood of Christ washing away our sins, as acknowledged and professed through baptism.

Green- symbolizing this season of mission - the incarnate Christ has been made manifest to us on Epiphany and we are to go into the world and share his Good News.

Isaiah 42:1-9; Psalm 29; Acts 10:34-43; Matthew 3:13-17

<u>Isaiah</u>

The book of Isaiah (OT) is attributed to three prophets. The first of whom is from where the book gets its name, and is about Isaiah's call to become a prophet and his prophecy that Jerusalem will face God's judgement regarding its immorality in order to be God's Holy City (chaps. 1-39, written 738-688 B.C.), the second is about living in exile in Babylon (chaps. 40-55, written 597-539 B.C.), and the third is about the return from exile to Judah and the rebuilding of the Temple (chaps. 56-66, written 520-515 B.C.). A prophet is one who is divinely appointed by God to lead and instruct.

Psalm 29

This OT song of praise is attributed to King David, sung in honor of God's power and glory as revealed

in a great thunderstorm.

The Acts of the Apostles

The Gospel of Luke and The Acts of the Apostles (NT) are attributed to Luke "the beloved physician" written around 59-90 A.D. This is essentially volume 2 of the Gospel of Luke. The Book of Acts records the ministry of the early church after the ascension of Jesus Christ into heaven, and guides us how we are to live, act, work, and be the church.

The Gospel According to Matthew

Matthew's Gospel was written around 80-90 A.D. in Antioch, Syria by a Greek-speaking Jewish Christian.

The first writing was probably by a Christian scribe who wrote in the name of Matthew. Matthew was a disciple who knew Jesus personally.


